

NORTHEAST SUPPLY ENHANCEMENT



The **Northeast Supply Enhancement** (NESE) project is a proposed \$1 billion enhancement of **existing energy infrastructure** in Pennsylvania, New Jersey and New York in time for the 2020 winter heating season.

The project enhancements will help the existing pipeline system transport an **additional 400 million cubic feet of natural gas supply per day** to northeastern consumers through National Grid — the largest distributor of natural gas in the northeastern United States.


Once complete, the project will serve growing natural gas demand in the Northeast, including the **1.8 million customers served by National Grid** in Brooklyn, Queens, Staten Island and Long Island.
